

Rental Households Amid Pandemic

43 million

There are about 43 million rental households in the United States.

Nearly 40 million American renters were at risk of eviction in 2020.

Free

or reduced rent was one of the most common rental concessions.

Eviction moratoriums have been proclaimed in **most states** and extended throughout the year.

How is the government supporting the vulnerable population?

The first round of Stimulus Package Checks \$1200 per person

The second round of Stimulus Package Checks \$600 per person

New legislation allows lower-income households (with less than 80% of median income in the area) to apply for **emergency rental assistance.**

Changes in the way rent is paid

- The percentage of rent payments paid with a credit/debit card has increased by **5**%
- Rent payments made online demonstrated a far greater share of timely payments than an average rent payment (92% vs 55%)

The average rent prices in states like North Dakota, Idaho, Wyoming have increased


